### DR. LARRY V. SANT

Dr. Larry Vaughn Sant, 34, of 2260 Ada, who worked with the Speech Pathology and Audiology Department at Idaho State University, died Monday in the LDS Hospital in Salt Lake City from heart complications. Nov. 3 1975.

Dr. Sant was born March 20, 1941 at Pocatello, the son of Sherman W. and June H. Jensen Sant. From 1960 until 1962, he filled a mission in Northern California for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

He married Georgia Louise Caso Sept. 11, 1964 in the Los Angeles LDS Temple. He received his bachelor of science degree from Idaho State University in 1966, his master's degree in 1967, and his Ph.D. from Northwestern University in Illinois in 1970.

During 1971, he served as consultant at Walter Reed Hospital in Washington, D.C. He had taught five years at Idaho State University and the past two years was chairman of the Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology. This year he was made an associate professor.

Dr. Sant had been active in the American Cancer Society, a board member of United Campaign, a member and officer of the Human Development Council, legislative counselor for the American Speech and Hearing Association, and also a member in the International Association of Oral Myology.

Survivors include his wife of Pocatello; his parents of Pocatello; two sons, Travis Vaughn and Christopher George, and two daughters, Angelo Kay and Courtney Georgette of Pocatello; two brothers, William L. of Pocatello and Sherman of Twin Falls; two sisters, Mrs. Larry (Julie) Cox and Mrs. Fred (Sharon) Ranstrom, both of Pocatello.
